A Message from National President Andrea Niedenthal

Happy Spring everyone!! I want to begin with a correction, last month Theta Tau – Midland, MI was marked as disbanded but that was in error. Instead, Iota Delta – Newburgh, IN should have been marked disbanded. Sorry for this oversight and any confusion it may have caused our Theta Tau chapter members, as they by far are still a very active chapter.

This month we are going to highlight the 1980's which started our slowing down for installing new chapters, we would however surpass \$500,000 in donations annually. At our convention in June 1981, the delegates voted to establish a Psi Iota Xi National Memorial Fund. Its purpose was to honor our deceased members and friends through a living memorial. The idea originated in the Past National Presidents meeting in June 1980 and



still is overseen by the PNP's. This fund annually provides a scholarship to a deaf dancer from Gallaudet University in Washington D.C.

We continued our strong relationship with ASHA, including helping to fund "How Does Your Child Hear and Talk" brochure. This became ASHA's most popular publication and was widely distributed in the early 80's. In 1980 alone 155,000 copies were mailed from ASHA's national office. In 1989 it was also printed in Patient Care Magazine and credited Psi Iota Xi and ASHA for the publication.

In the mid 1980's Psi Iota Xi started its partnership with Riley Hospital to partially fund the salary for the Deaf Educator for the Cochlear Implant Research Team. Later this would become a Long-Term Project (LTP) and establish our relationship with Dr. Miyamoto. We continued funding for Hoosier Art Salon, Metropolitan Opera Auditions, Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology, and Lexington Hearing and Speech Center. The Elise Sweeney Fund continued to purchase student tickets for multiple Symphonies within the State of Indiana, and we were recognized by President Ronald Reagan for our dedication to service.

Our organization grew in the 1980's by seven chapters, the following chapters were installed:

Hoosier Art Salon Paintings

In 1969, Zeta Tau received “**Little Girls**” by Helen Briggs Duckwall at National Convention. The painting was on display at Milroy Public School until it closed. A member of Zeta Tau is currently storing the painting until they find a new location to display it.



Helen L. Briggs Duckwall was born February 12, 1912, in Sheridan, Indiana. She attended John Herron School of Art and the Philadelphia School of Fine Arts. She exhibited at John Herron AI, Ball State AM and The Hoosier Salon in 1938, 53, 56, 57, 59, 61, 62, 64, 65, and 67. Helen is well known for her portraits of children and women in pastel, which she executed on commission through Lyman Brothers, Inc., in the late 1930's. Most of her artistic career was spent Indianapolis. In 1967 Helen painted the portrait of Indiana Governor Rodger D. Branigin. Helen passed away February 27, 1988, in Clearwater, Florida

In 1961, Zeta Gamma-Fort Branch, Indiana received “**1905 Model**” by Burling Boaz Jr. at National Convention. The painting is currently on display at the Fort Branch Johnson Township Library. It has been on loan to the library for **61 years**.



Burling was born February 26, 1891 in Indianapolis, Indiana and passed away on September 24, 1968. He began his career as designer of stained-glass windows for churches while working for the Erkins Co of Cincinnati. He also designed ornamental iron for another firm. In 1961 Burling Boaz, Jr. won *Outstanding Watercolor, Any Subject Merit Award of \$50 for 1905 Model*. It was designated by the Psi Iota Xi selection committee as one of the sorority's three purchase prizes. Recognized for his skill in tempera and opaque watercolor, the self-taught painter ran a sign painting business in Indianapolis. He had also served at Herron Art School as a part time instructor. Over the years Psi Iota Xi purchased four of Burling Boaz paintings. Burling Boaz, Jr. exhibited at the Hoosier Salon, 1952; Indiana Art Show and Indiana State Fair. His prizes include Hoosier Salon 1948 and 1961.

March 19, 2022

About 30 members of Psi Iota Xi gathered at KIDS HAVEN, by Sandy in LaGrange, KY to attend the Kentucky State Association meeting. Their theme was "Kentucky Psi Otes Are Getting Back on Track for a Better Year." Zeta Iota Chapter, Louisville, KY, hosted the meeting with Sandy Johnson, Kentucky State President, presiding over the meeting.

Delegates and guests enjoyed coffee and danish after signing in to register for the meeting. They also had time to purchase tickets to the raffle baskets provided by each of the three Kentucky chapters and a 50/50 raffle.

Sandy opened the meeting by having everyone introduce themselves. Five National Council members attended along with one PNP. There were members from Zeta Iota, Theta Nu, and Iota Chi Chapters. After the introductions, minutes and the treasurer's report were read and approved.







Sandra Damewood Worthen passed away on Sunday, February 13, 2022 at IU Ball Memorial Hospital. She was born March 12, 1937 in Washington, DC when it was still a small town, the first daughter of Gladys and Talbert Damewood, Sandra graduated from Calvin Coolidge High School in January 1955, where she was President of the Student Council.

She earned a B.A. from American University in Political Science in 1958. Active in student life and member of Phi Mu sorority, she was also selected for Mortar Board. In 1959 while completing her Master's Degree in Government and Public Administration she served as the Director of a Freshman Women's Residence Hall. In 1960 she married

John Worthen who had joined the University as Director of Housing. Following college Sandra was employed at the Library of Congress, Legislative Reference Service from 1958 to 1961 as a social science analyst.

In 1961 they moved to Boston and Sandra took courses in the Harvard Master of Arts in Teaching program. Then she taught eighth grade social studies in Lexington, MA for two years helping support John who was studying for his doctorate.

In 1963 John accepted a position at the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware. Sandra taught high school for three years and then decided to run for the Delaware House of Representatives. It was 1972, the first time Joe Biden ran for the US Senate. Both were on the same ballot; both won. She served six years as a Democrat and then the Republican Governor, Pete

DuPont, asked her to serve as Special Assistant for Education and lead the desegregation of schools in the county.

Sandra was adamant that they become a family and they adopted two wonderful children, Samantha in 1966 and Bradley in 1969.

In 1979 John was named President of Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Sandra became part of the leadership team as First Lady of the University. In 1984 John was appointed President of Ball State University. Sandra's role as a team member included planning and organizing dinners and receptions to recognize and entertain students, faculty, Alumni, legislators and state officials. She also brought together and encouraged faculty women and wives of male faculty. She was active in AAUW, the BSU Women's Club, the Conversation Club, Muncie Art Students League and the Art Alliance. She was an active member of Psi Iota Xi Alpha Chapter for 34 years. She loved participating in Ball State events and in the life of the community.

Sandra was skillful in communicating with people with different points of view and experiences. Her ability to remember names was remarkable. Her Mother developed Alzheimer's disease and this prompted Sandra to complete a Master's Degree in Gerontology at Ball State and later found Daystar, a respite program for the memory impaired. She continued to be active at the state level on the Indiana State Alzheimer's Task Force and the Indiana Commission on Aging.

Locally she was pleased to be recognized with several awards, including the President's Medal of Distinction, Ball State University, 2001; the Kirkpatrick Award for Service, 1996; and the Perham Indiana Women of Achievement Award, 2001. In 2000, the BSU Women's Club established a named scholarship for Sandra. This was especially gratifying as the scholarship is awarded annually to a non-traditional student.

Sandra's faith was unswerving. She was an active member of First Presbyterian Church and served as a deacon and elder. She loved learning and enjoyed reading and talking with friends and travel. She and John made many domestic and international trips, some with their children and several after retirement. Sandra always compiled a book of photos and a diary. They retired in 2000 and for 15 years spent three months in the summer hiking and three months in the winter skiing and snowshoeing in Steamboat Springs, CO.

She is survived by her husband, John, daughter, Samantha (of Atlanta) son, Bradley (wife Angela) Grandson Andrew (all of Steamboat Springs, CO) and sister, Diana (of Muncie).

A memorial service will be held at a later date. Memorial contributions may be made to First Presbyterian Church, or the Ball State University Foundation.
