

Our tour guide was Victoria Duncan, Supervisor of Rare Books and Manuscripts. During our tour we were able to visit the Vault where our Psi Iota Xi National Minutes and Helicons are


located. The vault is a climate control room that will help protect and preserve materials that are stored in it.

Hoosier Art Salon Paintings

This month I thought I would share some information about the first pictures that were given to Psi Iota Xi Chapters and highlight the artists.

Paintings during the first year were given to the following chapters:

1941 - Beta Omega, New Albany, Indiana; "Along the Beach" by J. C. Templeton. John Cowan Templeton (1872-1945) was born in Chicago, Illinois and spent the majority of his career working in Indiana, exhibiting at the Hoosier Salon, Northern Indiana Artists Salon, and the Indianapolis Art Club. He preferred landscapes and is well known for his scenes of the Indiana dunes. The painting was given the following description in an article from the Indianapolis News on January 27th, 1941: Taken from a high point, this study in curves includes a curve of a hill and below a curve of sand holding a blue curve of lake water.



1941 - Gamma Beta, Remington, Indiana; "Petunias and Ageratum" by Sibyl H. Connell. Sybil Hunt Connell (1895 – 1983) was active/lived in Indiana, North Carolina. Sybil Connell is known for Still life, portrait and landscape painting. This painting was given the following description in an article from the Indianapolis News on January 27th, 1941: Seen as through a morning haze had fallen across this flower grouping. It was outstanding in a room of flower studies.

1941 – Theta, New Castle, Indiana; "Zero Winter" by Edward K. Williams. Edward K. Williams (1870 - 1950) was active/lived in

Indiana. Edward Williams is known for his landscape paintings. This painting was given the following description in an article from the Indianapolis News on January 27th, 1941: His water snow-scene of an irregular alley or street in Nashville is a deft work seemingly achieved with the minimum of effort so vital to good aqua painting.





Nancy taught music with Marion Community Schools, Taylor University, and other school systems throughout her over 40 years of teaching. She will be missed by faculty, friends, and students. From Riverview Rockets and Allen choirs to Justice Middle School choir, Sweet Inspirations, Men's Choir and the 26th Street Singers, her ability to bring out the best in students and give them the belief in their voices and themselves will live on forever through her thousands of students.

Nancy was a woman who loved deeply. She is remembered fondly and honorably by her husbands throughout her lifetime: Joe Everett Peterson, Jim Beck, and Kelly Clore. She leaves behind four beautiful children who had blessed her with a son-in-law, three daughters-in-law, and ten amazing grandkids, all who carry with them a piece of this one-of-a kind personality, a musical voice, and a love of music, laughter, silliness, and deep love. Nancy has been active in the many organizations over her time on this earth: Marion Civic Theatre, Marion Philharmonic Orchestra, Psi Iota Sorority--making her thousands of cheese balls, an honorary lifetime member Grant County Lyric Club. She was a musical genius, singer, producer, and creative director. She stole the stage the moment she entered stage right and exited stage left or entered the orchestra pit or took a bow. Her accolades include: Sing for Your Supper, My Fair Lady, I Do I Do, Oliver, Big River, Secret Garden, Annie, and so many more. She also toured on stage with the Grant County Players and performing across the country in Plaza Suites with Jim Shildmyer.

Beyond music, Nancy loved water activities and snow skiing. Her love was her lake home on Sechrist Lake. There her heart will always remain, and her family and friends will forever keep memories and a piece of her always with them.

Maxine Ivonne Woods, 93, of Greenwood, passed away July 27, 2022.


She was born October 24, 1928 in Princeton, Indiana to the late Fred and Maud Miller Heiserman.


