A Message from National President **Rhonda McNall-Crisenbery**

Most of us are mothers, sisters, daughters and/or caregivers at a point or two in our lives. Many times, we contrive to make life or a project easier. Marion Donovan did exactly that to help the lives of women everywhere; she invented a waterproof diaper cover, US Patent No. 2.556.800. She was an inventor who

flourished outside of a traditional setting.

She was born in Fort Wayne, IN, (1917-1998) as Marion O'Brien, and grew up in an industrial family; whose father and



uncle invented the "South Bend lathe" a tool used to grind automobile gears. After attending college, marrying (James Donovan) and after having children she found the job of motherhood lasting well beyond the average eight-to-five work. Donovan was frustrated by having to repeatedly change her child's soiled cloth diapers and leaving the crib soaked.

Marion felt there had to be a better way to prevent diaper leaks. In an excerpt from

invent.org, "she assembled material from a shower curtain, she cut and sewed pieces into a waterproof diaper cover. This led to a diaper cover made from breathable parachute cloth, which included an insert for an absorbent diaper panel and used snap fasteners instead of safety pins." Donovan called this product the "Boater" because she believed it "looked like a boat.""

Marion's "Boater" did not squeeze the skin or cause tenderness. With this invention she tried to sell her product to US manufacturers.

though, she was met with disappointment. After receiving zero offers, she decided to go into manufacturing herself. In 1949, Saks Fifth Avenue agreed to sell her "Boaters" in their stores, with rousing success. In 1951, Marion received a patent for her invention. In the long run she succeeded in revolutionizing the infant care industry by inventing the disposable diaper; along with numerous other patents.

She was determined to move forward in the face of many NO's. There may be times we encounter:

- You can't do that.
- That is a silly idea.
- That is just not possible.



Marion's determination and drive led to great things in her life. We as Psi Ote sisters should emulate Mrs. Donovan's resolve. Be determined to succeed with a new fund raiser; be determined to support a chapter sister to serve on National Council; be determined to submit a new project to the Indiana Board and/or National Council; Be Determined!

Increasing & Retaining Members

Your chapter has probably tried most, if not all, these methods for inviting guests to your chapter socials and meetings. At the risk of repeating something your chapter has already tried, the following options come to mind.

Start with our areas of interest: Art, Literature, Music, Speech & Hearing. Who do you know?



- Art art teachers at the local schools, a docent in a local art gallery, someone you know who creates art for their own enjoyment.
- Literature school librarian, public librarian, other library employees or members of a local book club.
- Music music teachers at school, musicians at church, private lesson music teachers.
- Speech & Hearing school speech therapist, local audiologist, the mothers of children Psi Otes has helped with camp, hearing aids etc.

Another pool for possible members is those who have become new members

at your church or moved into your neighborhood in the last year. Reach out to the girls of the senior class at your local high school(s). Invite them to an informational social.

Periodically review the list of lapsed or inactive members of your chapter. Many took on these statuses because of family or work demands - it's possible that their obligations have changed which would allow them to rejoin you.

Last but not least in this very mobile time in which we live, we at times lose members who move due to relocation. In the event of a member's relocation, if it is to a state with a Psi Ote Chapter, supply your member with the contact information for the chapter nearest to their new location. Contact the president of that chapter to share information about your member moving to that area.

Again, these all may be things you regularly do in your search to gain or efforts to retain members, but if just one is new or something you have not tried in a while it may be the key to gaining new members

Psi Iota Xi's national insurance **DOES NOT COVER:**

• Individual events that chapters sponsor which involves the general public;

- speech and hearing clinics
- events involving liquor
- any volunteer, family member, friends, etc. assisting at a cheeseball making or other fund raising event

- to obtain a General Liability policy for your chapter. This can be a one-day event policy or a policy written annually for chapters that hold recurring events.
- Extra Option: If your chapter wishes to obtain a Director's or Owner's policy Nelson Insurance Agency can help you with those policies also.

Questions that have been asked:

- 1. Are chapters required to use Nelson Insurance Agency?
 - No. If your community wishes to obtain a policy from a local insurance agent that is fine. Please confirm with the agent he/she is providing the best policy available for complete coverage.
- 2. The facility where my event is being held provides liability insurance, is that ok?
 - When signing a contract for use/rental of a facility, please thoroughly read the documentation that they in fact will be providing the liability insurance in case of accidents for all in attendance. It is best not to

assume!
